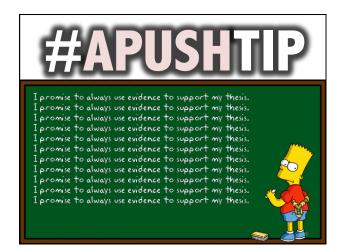

Compare and contrast the development of the New England and the Chesapeake colonial regions. Analyze the reasons that by 1700 the regions had evolved into two distinct societies.

1st paragraph

England's colonization of North America began with the first permanent English settlement at Jamestown. To encourage colonization England offered charters in the New World to prospective settlers and various joint stock companies were set up to help finance the high price of setting up a colony. As the mother country, England pursued colonization in an attempt to enrich the country as part of the economic theory of mercantilism. Although both the New England and Chesapeake were settled by England, the motives for colonization, the characteristics of the colonists, and the geography of the region contributed to the regions evolving into two distinc societies. However, in spite of both colonies developing into two distinct societies, both would share similarities such as the development of English political institutions and administration under the British mercantile system.

Thesis tip: To earn this point, the thesis must make a claim that responds to the prompt, rather than merely restating or rephrasing the prompt. The thesis must consist of one or more sentences located in one place, either in the introduction or the conclusion.

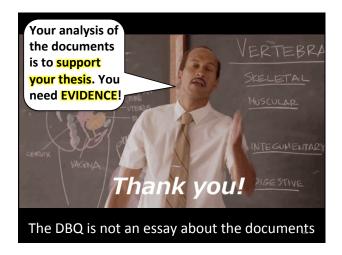
